The Knot 2023 Engagement and Jewelry Study states that two (or more) years is the typical length of a relationship before marriage. This was the case for slightly more than 70% of the couples polled, or roughly 30% of couples who got engaged in less than two years. An additional internal study discovered that US couples who got married in 2023 had an average engagement period of 15 months (The Knot, 2023).

In Pakistan, marriages typically adhere to Islamic marital jurisprudence; however, there may be local and regional differences. Marriage is viewed as an alliance between the families of the husband and wife as well as a connection between them. Pakistani men and women have formed and uphold certain wedding customs, which are relevant to marriage in that country. Compared to their parents, today's couples marry later in life. In Pakistan, generally, 18.6 years is the median age of marriage for women in the 25-49 age range. Compared to rural areas (18.4 years), this figure is marginally higher in urban areas (19.1 years). The median age in Pakistan's is significantly lower in Baluchistan and Sindh and significantly higher in KPK and
